Synopsis of the Armenian Message

(Habakkuk 1:1-11)

We do not know much about the prophet Habakkuk personally. What we know is that he wrote this prophecy sometime between 612 BC – 587 BC. It was at a time of spiritual and moral decline in Judah. In this book the prophet raises some very important questions that speak to our issues today.

Verses 1-11 are Habakkuk's complaint against God and God's unexpected answer to the prophet. The prophet starts by complaining to God about the moral and spiritual decay that is all around Him. He cannot understand why God tolerates all the corruption, violence, and injustice. The prophet is even more baffled by God's unexpected answers. God says that He is using Judah's godless enemies, the Babylonians, to punish them. Such a thing was unthinkable to the Judeans.

As we sometimes ask questions such as those posed by Habakkuk, let us remember these lessons. (1) God is still in control of world history even when it doesn't seem like it. (2) The sovereign God does not always operate the way we expect Him to. (3) God is moving according to His timetable and His universal plan.
