Synopsis of the Armenian Message

Paul has decided to travel to Jerusalem to deliver an offering to the poor from the churches in Asia Minor. On his way to Jerusalem, Paul continues to preach the Gospel in every city that he visits. In Troas, he spoke until midnight. As the night wore on, with many lamps in the room, perhaps it became hot and stuffy. A young man called Eutychus, meaning lucky or fortunate, who probably was seeking fresh air by sitting in the window, fell asleep and fell down three stories to his death. Paul very calmly went down and stretched himself over the young man and restored him to life (see I Kings 17:7-24).

The same God who worked through the prophets of the past and raised Jesus from the dead, is at work here through Paul to restore Eutychus back to life. The same Living God continues to save lives today and to advance the ministry of the Church of Jesus Christ.
