SYNOPSIS OF THE ARMENIAN SERMON

In 1 st . John 4:1-3, the apostle John cautions us not to believe in false prophets. He says that anyone who does not acknowledge Jesus coming in the flesh is not from God. The doctrine of the incarnate Christ is crucial for the Christian faith. It is the foundation of which we stand on.

Here are three focal points Jesus and the apostle John makes in this passage about being cautious of false prophets:

- **1.** Many False Prophets are out there: Jesus and the apostle John warn us about many false prophets and teachers. We need to know God's Word thoroughly to distinguish false teachers from good teachings.
- **2.** Jesus Christ has been incarnated. The Bible strictly prohibits any doctrine that stands against the teaching that Jesus Christ is the Son of God who came in the flesh. He is the only hope of salvation for humanity.
- **3.** There can only be one absolute truth: With so many religions and ideologies, it is hard to comprehend sometimes where the truth lies. Every believer needs to be well nourished by the Word of God to remain in the light and in the presence of the Lord to guide them in the truth.
