## SYNOPSIS OF THE ARMENIAN SERMON

In Matthew 18, Jesus taught his disciples that unless we humble ourselves and become like little children, we can never enter the kingdom of God. Heaven has no place for the prideful. We are reminded in God's Word that He opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble. Our heart has to change and be transformed like a child's heart, innocent and humble, with no status of pride. Here are three focal points Jesus makes about entering the kingdom of God:

- 1. Jesus poses the question: Who is the greatest in the kingdom of God? He answered the question himself by calling a little child to him and demonstrated that unless we change and become like little children, we can never enter the kingdom of God. No room for pride.
- **2.** Children Do Not Seek Status: Children have no agenda. They depend on their parents and do not seek any high status. They are humble. In the same way, we need to fully depend on God's grace and seek no attention. John the Baptist said of Jesus, He must increase, I must decrease.
- **3.** The Kingdom of God open for all who serve humbly: Jesus said if anyone welcomes a child in my name, welcomes me. When we serve one another out of humility, we are literally doing it to and for Christ. It is a lifestyle, not just dos and
