SYNOPSIS OF THE ARMENIAN SERMON

Paul warns us that in the last days people will only want to hear what their "itching ears" want to hear. Neglecting the truth of the word of God and going about what we feel is good and right is a dangerous way of living. Proverbs 14:12 says, "there is a way that seems right to a man, but its end is the way of death."

Here are three focal points that show us that sound doctrine is the way of life:

- **1.** We are cautioned to avoid following our own sinful nature: The Bible warns us that in the last days people will want to hear what pleases them. This is dangerous because our path leads to death, but if we follow the footsteps of Jesus, we will find the truth and the fountain of life.
- **2. Building our faith on sound doctrine**: Yes, there is absolute truth that we can live by, which is only found in Christ Jesus. Jesus prayed to the Father in John 17, "now this is eternal life: that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent. Jesus Christ is the truth of God.
- **3.** Choosing the Narrow Path: Paul tells Timothy to endure hardship for the truth of the gospel. We need to cherish and hold fast to what has been given to us through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. We have received the free gift of eternal life and we need to stay in the truth of Christ and not give in to false teachings.
