CHEF FOR DECEMBER

Festive Bean Salad!

Ingredients:

Chopped green onion
Cut up green parsley
1 or 2 cans red kidney beans
1 or 2 cans green beans
1 or 2 cans yellow beans
Red wine vinegar and one lemon
Extra virgin olive oil
Salt and pepper to taste

Preparation: Cut green onion and parsley into small pieces. Open, drain, and rinse one or two cans of beans—red kidney beans, green beans, yellow beans.

Assemble: Carefully mix together with a couple squirts of red wine vinegar and a squeezed lemon. Drizzle with extra virgin olive oil, salt and pepper to taste.

Serve: Exhibit in a beautiful bowl, and you may garnish with green pepper, sliced wedges.
